Organization of School Year

The school year consists of four quarters, each nine weeks long. The day is divided into seven 50-minute periods. The first semester ends on January 13, 2017, and the second semester ends on June 6, 2017.

The Fall 2016 enrollment at Westmont High School is 446 students, with 82 seniors in the Class of 2017. The average per pupil operating cost in the 2014-2015 school year was \$18,354.29.
