The school is 18 miles west of Chicago and serves a suburban residential area of approximately 25,000 people. Students live in sections of Westmont, Clarendon Hills, and Downers Grove.

Organization of School Year

The school year consists of four quarters, each nine weeks long. The day is divided into seven 50-minute periods. The first semester ends on December 18, 2015, and the second semester ends on May 31, 2016.

The Fall 2015 enrollment at Westmont High School is 447 students, with 100 seniors in the Class of 2016. The average per pupil operating cost in the 2013-2014 school year was \$17,516.46.
